The wine's character

Wines from the "Les Avaux" parcel exhibit a deep, intense color. The bouquet is complex and expressive, combining animal notes with layers of leather, red and black fruits, and berry tones like blackcurrant and morello cherry. On the palate, it is both silky and dense, showing undeniable poise and balance within a generous, full-bodied frame. The tannins are present but never overwhelming—seamlessly integrated with flavors of ripe cherry and subtle hints of candied fruit.

Terroir, origin, and identity

The vineyards of Beaune lie along a steep slope that rises to 330 meters. The hillside is composed of fragmented limestone, while the base is colluvial with outcrops of Upper Bathonian limestone. Further downslope, most of the vineyards are planted on beds of limestone scree with a southeast to south-facing exposure. The slope is divided in two by the Bouzaise Valley. "Les Avaux", located on the southern side of the valley and partway up the slope, benefits from a very clay-limestone-rich soil—ideal for wines with character.



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
